From Fr. Cloherty

Starting last Wednesday, I have been on a seven-day vacation at a friend's home in Carey North Carolina. Carey is west of Raleigh. Vacation time often means visiting in other people's homes or having visitors in our homes. As summer approaches, it brings to mind some advice on visitors *From the Rule of St. Benedict*.

From the Rule of St. Benedict

If any pilgrim monk shall come from distant parts with a wish to dwell in the monastery, and will be content with the customs of the place, and does not by his lavishness disturb the monastery but is simply content, he shall be received for as long as he wishes.

If, indeed, he shall find fault with anything, and shall expose the matter reasonably and with the humility of charity, the Abbott shall discuss it with him prudently lest perchance God hath sent him for this very thing. But, if he shall have been found to be a gossip and argumentative during his sojourn in the monastery, then not only should he not be made a member of the monastery community, but he should be told politely and firmly to depart. If he will not go, let two stout monks, in the name of God, explain the matter to him
