Dear Sister Loretta:

As you are aware, on this date after 32 years of service to our parish, Sr. Marie Madigan is retiring as director of religious education. Since 1976, she has been a constant and faithful presence to generations of young people and religious education teachers.

As you know, when one serves a parish community there can be a vast difference between the written job description and the work one is ultimately called upon to do.
