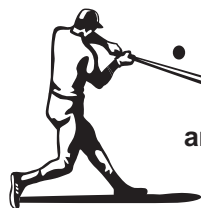

We at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish wish each of you a happy, safe and healthy summer. Here are some hot weather safety prevention tips from the CDC

- Drink more fluids (nonalcoholic), regardless of your activity level. Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink. Warning: If your doctor generally limits the amount of fluid you drink or has you on water pills, ask him how much you should drink while the weather is hot.
- Stay indoors and, if at all possible, stay in an air-conditioned place. If your home does not have air conditioning, go to the shopping mall or public library—even a few hours spent in air conditioning can help your body stay cooler when you go back into the heat. Call your local health department to see if there are any heat-relief shelters in your area.
- Electric fans may provide comfort, but when the temperature is in the high 90s, fans will not prevent heat-related illness. Taking a cool shower or bath, or moving to an air-conditioned place is a much better way to cool off.
- Wear lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
- NEVER leave an animal or person in a closed, parked vehicle.
- Although anyone at anytime can suffer from heat-related illness, some people are at greater risk than others. Check regularly on:
 - Infants and young children
 - People aged 65 or older
 - People who have a mental illness
 - Those who are physically ill, especially with heart disease or high blood pressure

Visit adults at risk at least twice a day and closely watch them for signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke.

Remember: Please don't drink and drive

From Fr. Cloherty

Here is a little something once again from my Good Stuff folder. It was shared with me by a wise Jesuit priest some years ago on my annual retreat and very much in the Jesuit tradition:

"We want to be ready and available for whatever the Lord might ask of us, different from what we might expect or want; a destiny we do not merit, or on the other hand a destiny easier than we had imagined. All is in the hands of the Lord, His supreme freedom. It is He who will gather all things into Himself, and our attachment to Him in faith, that is, in accepting whatever He plans and proposes for us,—that's what, in the final analysis, really counts."

She told every Brazilian in the world and New Yorker that she was asking her roommate to leave and provided more than adequate reasons for such a decision or prison time. Her roommate should have put her out. Her beauty, as abundant as it was, did not compensate me or all those on the train."
