From Fr. Cloherty

Next weekend, Fr. Robert Jeffers from Catholic Relief Services will be visiting us. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is the official international relief and development agency of the Catholic Church in the United States. CRS assists the poor and vulnerable in 100 countries, representing all of us. Fr. Jeffers is part of a national effort to raise awareness on behalf of the poor overseas and to provide different opportunities for all of us to get involved in this good work.

In recent years, CRS has been present and helping in the aftermath of the tsunami in Asia, Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans and more recently, the earthquake in Haiti. Two great things about CRS:

1. They have offices everywhere and they will work with any group to help people including Lutherans, Anglicans, Buddhists and Hindus. They may not always be the lead agency, but it is never a problem for them. In some cases such as in predominantly Muslim Indonesia, it is better to have Muslims lead and support the good work they are doing.
2. They incarnate the ideal proposed by Pope John XIII that Catholic Christians should be willing to work with all people of good will to resolve conflicts, feed the hungry and shelter the homeless.
